I'm Michelle, I'm the librarian/archivist at the Windsor Historical Society.

Oh.

I forgot my name tag. Can you tell us your name? Hold on one second. [pause] All right, would you mind telling us your name and how long you've lived in Windsor?

I'm Joel Ferola and I've lived in Windsor for two years. And I have a really good idea to give everybody and you might know it already. Real good idea, though. Here it is. And I typed the whole thing again and gave it to somebody and they said, "Oh my God, that is so special." It's something anybody can do, except it takes a long time.
