Ellsworth	Eliphelet	Lieutenant		Sept. 19, 1758	Died. He was in Capt. Wolcott's Co. Hayden heard of death Sept. 26.
Ellsworth	John			Oct. 17, 1758	Died. He was in Capt. Wolcott's Co. and Col. Lyman's Regiment.
Ellsworth	John, Jr.		Windsor, Ct.	Sept. 9, 1759	Promoted to Gen. Lyman's Co. as Captain-Lieutenant. On Nov. 18, his shirt was stolen by a washer-woman.
Filley	Jonah			Sept. 27, 1758	Died. He was in Capt. Wolcott's Co. The records show that Filley's death occurred on Sept. 16.
French	Richard			Sept. 28, 1759	Died. He was in Capt. Parson's Co.

Hull	Giles	Captain	Guilford, Ct.	Aug. 14, 1759	Died. He belonged to Gen. Lyman's Co.

Lewis	John			Oct. 12, 1759	Died. He was in Gen. Lyman's Co.
Loomis	Abel			Oct. 16, 1758	Died. He was sick and on his way home. He died at Greenbush, NY. Hayden heard of death Oct. 23.
Loomis	Eliphelet			Nov. 1, 1759	Whipped 25 lashes for talking "sasse" to Dr. Lord.
Lord	Elisha	Doctor	Norwich, Ct.	Nov. 1, 1759	Eliphelet Loomis was "sassy" to him.
Loring	Joshua	Commodore		Oct. 9, 1759	Fired a cannon and set sail for Crown Point.
Lyman	Phineas	Colonel	Suffield, Ct.	Oct. 23, 1758	Regiment got orders to be ready to march. On Oct. 27, his Regiment marched to about 4 miles of Fort Edward. From this date until Nov. 12 the regiment spent travelling back to Connecticut.
Lyman	Phineas	Major General	Suffield, Ct.	Jul. 22, 1759	Military activities by his Regiment.

Wolcott	David	Colonel	New Haven, Ct.	Aug. 2, 1759	Regiment ordered to stay and keep fort.
Wooster	David	Colonel	New Haven, Ct.	Oct. 8, 1759	Ordered to strike tents and sent to Crown Point.
